Busy Time in Washington

- · Election year

Numerous Issues Facing Tech Transfer

- Patent legislation
- NIH March-in Rights and drug pricing
- Regulations that could impact IP generated by federal research investments
- Fundamental misunderstandings about role IP plays in economy

Patent Reform Issues

- History
 - America Invents Act passes in 2011
 - Even before ink is dry, some patent users clamoring for more changes
 - Claims that patent "trolls" are hurting innovation
 - Legislation in last Congress stalled and pulled
 - Supporters renew effort in this Congress

Current Patent Bills

- HR 9 (House Judiciary Committee)
 - Of serious concern to higher ed
 - Fee shifting, joinder, other anti-patent provisions
 - AUTM working with AAU, APLU et al to oppose
 - Voted out of Judiciary Committee but has not come to House floor, thanks to numerous objections, particularly by conservatives
 - Inter partes review at PTO a major stumbling block

Current Patent Bills

- S. 1137 (Senate Judiciary Committee)
 - Similar bill to HR 9
 - Some improvements negotiated with higher ed but further changes sought
 - Approved by committee but similarly stalled by concerns, IPR issues

Latest Wrinkle

- S. 2733 (Flake/Gardner)
 - Venue provisions pulled out of House bill in attempt to try and move as separate legislation
 - Focused on high number of lawsuits filed in a few district courts (Eastern District of Texas, e.g.)
 - Issue less of a concern for higher ed, but could be vehicle for things we are concerned about
 - Consumer Technology Association supports

Courts Continue to Act

- U.S. Supreme Court to hear case about IPRs this month – decision in June
- · Venue issue also being addressed
- Many of the reasons legislation was proposed are being addressed by judicial system
- · Fewer lawsuits being filed
- Need for legislation unclear

Cuozzo Speed v. Lee

- Fight over how USPTO has used IPRs to consider patent validity
- Claims construction standard too broad
- Well beyond intent of American Invents Act
- A complement to court, not a substitute
- Courts should be able to review IPR decisions

Sequenom v. Ariosa Diagnostics

- Case deals with patent-eligible subject matter involving biotechnology
- Hopefully will rein in courts' use of "judicial exceptions" to deny patents to certain biologics
- AUTM has signed onto amicus brief

NIH March-in Rights


- Old issue with renewed focus
- Recent stories about high drug prices generated Dec. letter to HHS/NIH from 50 House Democrats, led by

Rep. Doggett (D-TX)

- Lawmakers urged agencies to use marchin authority to rein in drug prices
- In absence of that, urged that agencies create "reasonable guidelines"
- Later, two petitions about specific drugs were sent

NIH/HHS Reject Request

- Agencies say Bayh-Dole not designed to control drug prices, but to ensure companies do not sit on new therapeutics
- In late March, 12 House and Senate members rewrote, asking that agencies hold open public hearing on one such drug, Xtandi, developed at UCLA to treat prostate cancer

Difficult Issue

- PhRMA and BIO working to counter concerns
- Universities not the "culprit"
- Drug prices have become campaign issue
- Sen. Sanders one of the signers of the March letter

Open Licensing

- Proposed rule at Department of Education would require open licensing of software developed with federal grants
- Similar language at Department of Labor
- Associations have weighed in with concerns
- Working with library interests, hoping D of Ed will modify

OMB Open Source Issue

- Office of Management and Budget looking at draft "open source" policy announcement
- Would affect custom-designed software
- Possible pilot program would require at least 20% be open sourced
- OMB asking questions associations responding

NIST Looking at Bayh-Dole

- Learned recently of potential effort by NIST to re-interpret Bayh-Dole
- Another example of agency unaware of other activities, such as NIH march-in requests

Similar Threads

- · Outright attacks on patents
- Misunderstanding of how IP plays important role in developing technologies for public
- If not careful, government may take away incentives for companies to risk capital to develop new ideas, products

Tech Transfer Office Role

- You are the experts
 - You see early-stage technologies
 - You deal with faculty, inventors, capital markets
 - You understand cost of patenting, need to have exclusive rights to develop new ideas
 - You have examples of projects that have come to fruition and some that have not

Working with Your University Leadership

- Need to have unified view of role of tech transfer on your campus
- AAU and APLU presidents both had task forces last year reiterate notion that tech transfer occurs not to enrich university, but to serve the "public good"

Know Your Federal Relations Officer

- This person needs your expertise
- If you have in-house counsel, needs their reading on legislation or proposed rules
- This person needs your examples, your success stories
- This person is your key contact on all of these issues

First Rule of Thumb

- Explain to policymakers <u>how your business</u> works
 - Unless they see how ideas develop, become patents, get funding and support, they will never understand why we care about patents, IP
 - Need to understand relationship to capital markets, where risks must be taken to advance new technologies




