What are AUTM Partnering Forums?

- AUTM Partnering Forums are specialized networking events that:
 - · Focus on a specific industry sector
 - · Have a national (or international) scope
 - Are designed to foster networking and dialogue on partnering best practices between industry and academia
 - Are medium-sized (50-75 attendees)
 - · Are "hosted" by an AUTM member institution

What are the goals of Partnering Forums?

Primary

• Partnering: meeting one-on-one; reviewing industry needs, available technologies and collaboration opportunities; national/int'l focus

Secondary

 Learning about the industry: future trends, challenges, partnering structures, etc.

Tertiary

Showcasing your university's abilities and leadership in the sector.
 However, this should be considered a side benefit of hosting an event, and not be a significant part of the formal program.

Two possible hosting formats

Single Host

- One university leads proposal submission; event would typically be hosted on or near their campus.
- Planning committee consisting of people from several different universities and companies would <u>still</u> need to be formed.

Two possible hosting formats

Single Host

- One university leads proposal submission; event would typically be hosted on or near their campus (presumed cost savings).
- Planning committee consisting of people from several different universities and companies would still need to be formed.

Team Hosting

- Two to Four universities and/or companies would lead a proposal submission; these may be best suited for "neutral site" locations, perhaps timed with another significant event in the industry.
- · May be halfway to your planning committee already
- · May need increased sponsorship budget

Single Host example

- Crop Productivity, University of Saskatchewan
 - September 28-29, 2016
 - · Radisson Hotel in Saskatoon
 - · Timed with Global Biotech Week
 - 8 member planning committee half university, half industry
 - · 68 attendees
 - Exceeded sponsorship budget; sponsors included BASF, Wellspring and multiple law firms; was also supported by Canadian federal grant
 - Corporate attendees included: Syngenta, BASF, Bayer CropScience, Dow AgroSciences, Marron Bio, Novozymes

Team Host example

Animal Health & Nutrition, Kansas City, MO

- · September 1-2, 2015, Kansas City Marriott Downtown
- Co-"hosted" by Auburn University and Kansas State University
- · Timed with KC Animal Health Corridor events, including Inv. Forum
- · Built off of tech transfer event run by KSU
- 9 member planning committee 4 university, 5 industry
- 75 attendees
- · Exceeded sponsorship budget;
- Sponsors included Zoetis, Merck, Elanco, Boehringer Ingelheim, Wellspring, TechAccel, MVS, Planning Committee universities
- · Additional attendees: ThermoFisher, Cargill, Mars Pet, Abaxis
- · Ended with optional trip to Royals game

- · When considering various aspects of a proposal, ask:
 - · Will it attract industry reps to attend?
 - · University reps will typically follow
 - · Is it supportable from a budgetary standpoint?
