This prestigious program honors up to five promising individuals who show dedication and an enthusiastic yearning for all the profession holds.

The Howard Bremer Scholarship is named for one of the ground-breaking pioneers in the technology transfer world. Howard Bremer was a key voice in the development and enactment of the 1980 Bayh-Dole Act. In addition, Howard was a founding member of AUTM, serving as President, managing and writing for the AUTM Journal, and mentoring countless members.

AUTM builds upon these mentoring efforts with this legacy scholarship, growing and supporting our future AUTM leaders.

Eligibility

Scholarship applicants must be:

- A regular or student member of AUTM
- An employee of an academic, teaching, governmental, nonprofit research entity, or a related organization of such an entity established for the purpose of facilitating technology transfer, or an international counterpart, thereof
- Have less than two years of experience in the profession or, if a student, must be studying technology transfer in an accredited graduate program

- \$500 honorarium
- Travel support up to \$1,300 to the AUTM 2018 Annual Meeting
